## What Are Demons?:

- Definition and Origin:
  - Scripture Reference: Luke 10:18 Jesus says, "I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven."
  - o The fall of Lucifer and his followers (demons).
- Nature of Demons:
  - Scripture Reference: James 2:19 "You believe that God is one; you do well.
    Even the demons believe—and shudder!"
  - o Demons are spiritual beings with knowledge of God but in rebellion against Him.

#### The Influence of Demons:

- Possession and Oppression:
  - Scripture Reference: Mark 5:1-20 The Gerasene demoniac. Discuss the severity of possession and the transformation through Jesus.
- Deception and Temptation:
  - Scripture Reference: 2 Corinthians 11:14 "And no wonder, for even Satan disguises himself as an angel of light."
  - o How demons can influence thoughts and behaviors.

### Jesus' Authority Over Demons:

- **Scripture Reference:** Luke 4:31-37 Jesus commands an unclean spirit, showing His authority.
- Scripture Reference: Matthew 8:28-34 Jesus casts out demons from two men in Gadara.
- How does Jesus' authority assure believers of victory over demonic forces.

### Our Authority in Christ:

- Believers' Power:
  - Scripture Reference: Luke 10:19 "Behold, I have given you authority to tread on serpents and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy."
- Spiritual Armor:
  - Scripture Reference: Ephesians 6:10-18 How does the Armor of God protect us against spiritual attacks.

#### Myths and Truths about Deamons:

Myth: Satan is equal to God in power.

- Clarification: Satan is a created being and does not possess the same power or authority as God. God is omnipotent, while Satan is limited.
  - Scripture Reference: Job 1:6-12 shows that Satan operates within the boundaries set by God.

Myth: All mental illness is caused by demons.

- Clarification: While the Bible does describe instances of demon possession, mental illness can have various causes, including biological and psychological factors. Not all afflictions are due to demonic activity.
  - Scripture Reference: Mark 5:15 shows the distinction between physical ailments and demonic possession.

Myth: Demons are primarily malevolent spirits seeking to cause chaos.

- Clarification: While demons do seek to harm and lead people away from God, they can also disguise themselves as benevolent beings to deceive.
  - Scripture Reference: 2 Corinthians 11:14 "Satan disguises himself as an angel of light."

Myth: Satan is the ruler of Hell.

• Clarification: Satan is not in charge of Hell; it is a place of punishment prepared for him and his demons. Ultimately, he will be judged and cast into the lake of fire.

 Scripture Reference: Revelation 20:10 indicates that Satan will be thrown into the lake of fire.

### Myth: Every person has a personal demon assigned to them.

- Clarification: The Bible does not support the idea that individuals have specific demons assigned to them. While demons can influence people, there is no clear teaching on personal demons.
  - Scripture Reference: Ephesians 6:12 emphasizes the broader struggle against spiritual forces rather than individual assignments.

# Myth: Once a person is possessed by a demon, they can never be free.

- Clarification: The Bible shows that Jesus has the power to deliver individuals from demonic possession. True freedom is possible through faith in Christ.
  - Scripture Reference: Mark 5:1-20 demonstrates Jesus' authority to cast out demons and restore individuals.

# Myth: Demons are only a biblical phenomenon and don't exist today.

- Clarification: While the Bible provides the primary framework for understanding demons, many believe that spiritual warfare continues today, though the nature of such encounters may differ.
  - Scripture Reference: 1 Peter 5:8 warns believers to be vigilant against the adversary who seeks to devour.

# Myth: A Christian cannot be possessed by a demon.

- Clarification: While many believe that true believers cannot be possessed by demons due to the indwelling of the Holy Spirit, they can be oppressed or influenced.
  - Scripture Reference: Ephesians 6:12 emphasizes the ongoing spiritual battle believers face.
